





Due to COVID, National Road Safety Week was moved from its usual date in May to November. We are very grateful to the NSW Government and Transport for NSW for making the NRSW 2020 launch their first and only COVID-safe event in 2020.



An initiative of Safer Australian Roads and Highways (SARAH), and brought to life by its Principal Partners as well as our Government, Corporates, Unions and NGO supporters, National Road Safety Week (NRSW) highlights the impact of road trauma and looks at ways we can reduce it. Despite the impact of Covid-19, that included delaying the event from May to November, NRSW still managed to reach more than 120 million people through almost 2,500 media articles and social media mentions.

Now in its 9th year, NRSW has grown rapidly across the country, with State, Territory and Local Governments turning yellow for the Week, through the lighting of some of Australia's most iconic buildings, bridges and structures in both cities and regional areas, the introduction of road safety policies, provision of grants, road safety launches and campaigns, as well as community and other road safety awareness events. These activities result in what has become a significant media and social media presence, all in support of improving road safety outcomes.

In addition to the fantastic support of our Principal Partners, we remain indebted to the Governor-General, His Excellency Hon David Hurley AC DSC for His 2020 NRSW Statement, our Federal and State Ministers, especially the Deputy Prime Minister. Hon Michael McCormack MP. and the hosts of 2020 NRSW, Hon Andrew Constance MP, NSW Minister for Transport and Roads, as well as Hon Paul Toole MP, NSW Minister for Regional Transport and Roads. We also acknowledge each of the jurisdictions, specifically the Road Safety Ministers and their road authorities. I would also like to thank all our supporters from around the country, especially in our regional communities, for it is their work on the ground that helps make National Road Safety Week such a success!

Despite COVID-19 ensuring that 2020 NRSW would present so many challenges, it is heartening to see the increased creativity of our partners and supporters, as NRSW extended its engagement to include virtual events. While the threat of COVID will still be with us for the foreseeable future, given last year's success, we are excited that 2021 NRSW will be even more creative and an online launch presence is already planned.

So as the mantle passes from New South Wales to South Australia, I wish to sincerely thank both the Minister for Police and Emergency Services, Hon Vincent Tarzia MP, who has agreed to host the 2021 National Launch in Adelaide on Sunday 16 May, as well as the SA Department of Infrastructure and Transport that is already providing the necessary support to make 2021 NRSW a success.
















Too many lives are lost on our roads and we are all responsible for doing our bit to help make a difference in bringing the toll down.
